

## Michigan Justice Advocacy - Internship Application

Michigan Justice Advocacy is a 501(c)(4) nonprofit social welfare organization. We are actively collaborating with other criminal justice organizations, key stakeholders, and multiple Michigan State Legislators with the goal to develop meaningful policies, programs, and legislation for all those affected by crime and incarceration. This includes individuals who are currently, and who have been previously, incarcerated.

- What are some specific ways interns will support our mission? We are looking for passionate individuals who want to change the Criminal Justice System in the State of Michigan. We are looking for help with our grassroot efforts through various committees and pathways in our organizations including, Legislative, Research, Community, Donor or Media committees. Some projects could include doing research, writing reports on data, networking and volunteer training, or social media content creation.
- What are the goals of the internship program? We are looking for individuals to support our initiatives and in turn learn about political legislative lobbying efforts and grassroots community programing.
- What resources are available to support interns? We will provide weekly internship cohort meetings and bi-weekly committee meetings. This will be a mostly virtual internship, with opportunities in the future to join in community based organization efforts when safely possible.
- What is the time period for the internship? All internships are part time and flexible from 3 months to 12 months. We ask interns to committee a minimum of 5 hours per week to organizational efforts.
- What are the qualifications or educational requirements for an intern? We are looking for individuals in various majors and with a range of experiences to bring their skills to our organization. All interns will need to have access to technology and internet access.
- Will the internship be paid or unpaid? All internships are unpaid and eligible for academic credit (depending on school requirements)
